Our Speaker

Bishop Fraser Lawton was born in Saskatoon into an active Anglican Christian home. His family moved to Alberta when he was 8 years old, and he has continued to live there, except for his university years. He was blessed with a wide variety of church experiences through his childhood, including the influence of the 1970's charismatic movement in North American Anglicanism. He felt a call to ordained ministry at a young age, and entered the College of Emmanuel and St Chad in Saskatoon immediately after high school and then obtaining a BSc.

He was ordained Deacon in 1993 and priest in 1994 and has served his entire ordained ministry in the Diocese of Athabasca. He served in three parishes, with the majority of the time at St Thomas', Fort McMurray. St Thomas' was a non-traditional church in many senses, and allowed the active expression of gifts of the Spirit, contemporary worship and openness to "trying" different ways of expressing the gospel. In the last few years as rector, Bishop Fraser and his wife led the youth ministry in the parish, and were delighted to see amazing spiritual growth and the emergence of the gifts and leadership of the young people.

In 2010, the Lawton's left Fort McMurray and moved to Peace River, where he was consecrated bishop and began this new ministry. Fraser is married to Veronica, and they have four children, ranging in age from 13 to 20. Two children are in university, and two remain at home. Veronica and Fraser have been involved in various forms of music ministry since high school, and continue to value the opportunity to express worship to God in this way. Fraser is a sports fan, enjoys reading and puttering (on rare occasions) in his workshop. Bishop Fraser attended and then became a leader on six Anglican Renewal Ministries clergy and lay leadership training events, and was a member of the ARM Board for two years.




